






How old are you?




Where are you from?





Do you (or did you) own any of the following games consoles?




What is your favourite video game genre? (Tick as many as you like)







It's easier to remaster a game in terms of graphics and leave the same story line / stages than having to think of an entire story line, enemies, stages ecc. Also while doing that you have the certainty that it is already hyped by nostalgic players which know what to expect from a game which has been around for many years (Crash bandicoot for instance)

If you own a license to a popular game series, for example how EA Games currently owns the license for Star Wars, it can be safer to release a new version of a popular game (battlefront) than something entirely new. Plus if you pump these nostalgia games with micro transactions, you'll make tons of money...

You can't beat a classic game. Some of the new releases these days are just mimicking what they have released before with no real additional value (Fallout 76 is a big one!) and sometimes new releases can be worse than the original so people would prefer to play the older version.

Cash grab, laziness, banking on a recognisable franchise

I think one of the main reason publishers are focusing on that is that while they target 'older' audience which are prone to repurchase the game out of nostalgia and have guaranteed sales, it also has a good chance to get picked up by younger ones, which could open the path for more sequels and spinnoffs.

Some of the games are being released as revivals from companies who loved the games way back when. In some cases, like Activision and Crash Bandicoot, they are aiming to move the series forward while others are simply trying to make more next-gen money off old ideas.

One could also assume this is being done to avoid the piracy of old games, which is becoming more popular for older generations of consoles.

People like familiar things, so the name will make people interested.

Re-releasing or remaking a game makes it accessible to new players to get into the franchise.

Due to brand awareness, simpler and more cost efficient to market strategies. Increased conversions and sales

It's easier to remaster classic games than to develop ground up new ideas in an already saturated market - plus remastering games with modern technology allows for games to be re-experienced as if it were the first time.

Good opportunity to take advantage of an already well known and built game

People mix up IP with actual magic

Revamping games both in different settings, consoles has been around for a long time. Even boardgames get new versions (like monopoly) which are still similar but fits a certain person more or you can do a double sell of the same game.

Take Gta 5 for example, they first released it for PS4/Xbox, then waited a while got it out for PC. Then released it for next gen consoles, then went around releasing the older games for phones. Lot's of people bought the same game multiple times for multiple platforms. I own skyrim on PC (both paid for delux and standard), ps4 and nintendo switch.

Some of the people who used to play those games are probably parents and would want their kids to experience and share their own gaming experience.

It's easier to make something new with an idea which has already got roots in the public sphere rather than coming up with something completely new and start the process all over again.

It's faster and cheaper to re-brand an existing game instead of coming up with the resources for a new one

Nostalgia marketing

Easier to remake a game than think of new ideas. All hopping on the success of other remakes.

re branding


